## Welcome to the 2011 Conservation Bus Tour: *Spotlight on Lincoln County!*

Your tour guides today are USDA-NRCS Resource Conservationist **Mary Thompson**, Knox-Lincoln District Coordinator **Hildy Ellis**, and District Volunteer **Nancy Brown**. We are pleased to also have with us *Damariscotta Lake Watershed Association* Director **Al Railsback**. Please don't hesitate to ask questions at any time - someone is sure to know the answer!

### *Itinerary*

Our first stop is Damariscotta Lake in Jefferson, where we will visit a shorefront home that received a LakeSmart Award for conservation practices that reduce erosion and runoff to improve and maintain lake water quality.

**Julia Macleod** of *Damariscotta Lake Watershed Association* will detail the LakeSmart evaluation process and explain the conservation easement that protects the property from future development.



Next stop, *Morris Farm & Education Center* in Wiscasset. While we enjoy our morning coffee, tea & homemade sweets, **Kim Anderson, Farm Administrator**, will share the history this beautiful property. The Farm hosts a working dairy farm, gardens, & hiking trails. We also will press cider from locally picked apples



From Wiscasset, we head over to **Marge Kilkelly** and **Joe Murray's Dragonfly Cove Farm** in Dresden. The farm raises goats, pigs, & poultry for meat and sells eggs, garlic & their own hot cereal & pancake mixes. Joe will give us a tour of the barn that he and Marge designed and the new compost

facility that will keep nutrients on the farm and out of the rivers. *Marge and Joe have kindly offered the use of their farmhouse and deck for our picnic lunch.*

Last, but far from least, we will visit the gardens and backyard apiary of **Jean and Dick Vose** in Nobleboro. Not long after they moved here in 1998, Jean and Dick started the midcoast bee-keeping school and, in 2003, founded the *Knox-Lincoln County Beekeepers*. We will get a see the gardens and grounds, an observation hive, and get answers to all our honeybee questions.
